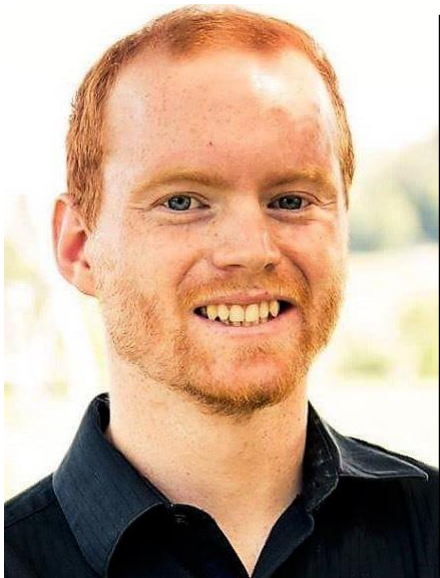




Michael S. Libby

He has performed and taught various styles of guitar/violin in contemporary and traditional worship, folk, Indie folk, and classical. Michael's studies and expertise include classical guitar/violin, fingerstyle, sacred and worship, and folk. 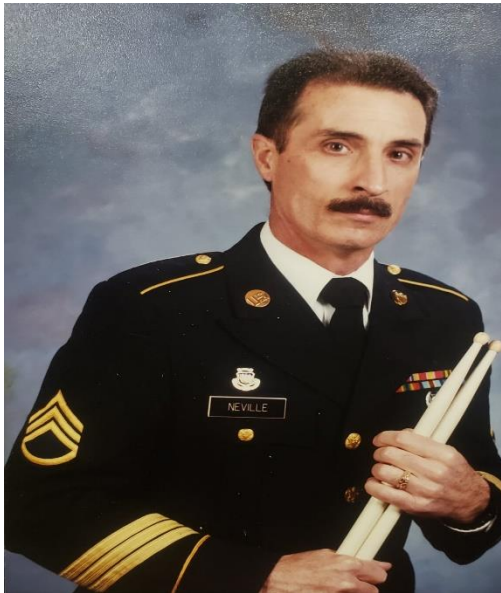

Gordon is a music teacher/band director with nearly 40 years of teaching and performing experience in both public and private schools in Florida and Michigan. Mr. Neville was a participant with his students in M.S.B.O.A. in both states. He received his B. F. A. degree from Florida Atlantic University December 1977 with graduate studies from North Florida University and Central Michigan University. Mr. Neville retired from Grand Rapids Public Schools in 2013, but before retiring, with help from a band parent (Jodie Alexiev), formed a community band focusing on swing, blues, and jazz. We named it "Grand Little Big Band." This band is a multigenerational group made up of young student musicians as young as 12 and include family members, teachers, and experienced musicians up to 80 years old.

Gordon directs rehearsals on Monday nights and features performances at retirement centers, The Home for Veterans, and The Hastings Jazz Festival. Mr. Neville was also the band director for Algoma Christian School for 6 years.
